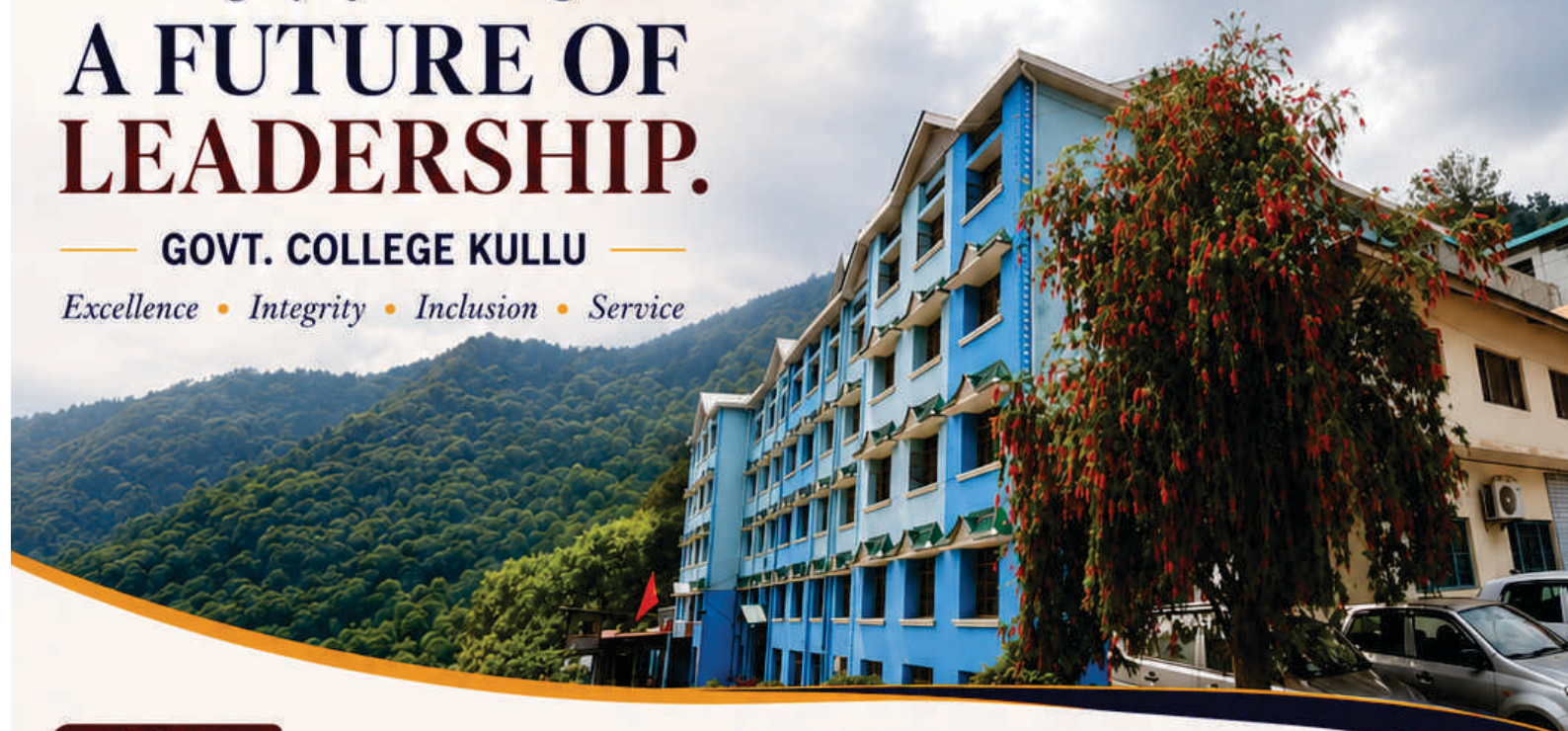

Curriculum And Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes Under NEP 2020 Guidelines

Undergraduate Degree Structure under NEP 2020

Degree options for Students

At the initial stage of implementation of the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**, students shall have the following degree options:

A. Three-Year Undergraduate Programme

The Three-Year Undergraduate Programme shall have the following degree options:

- 1. Multidisciplinary / Interdisciplinary Programme**
- 2. Single Core Discipline (Major) Programme**

- *Students shall declare their **Major** and **Minor** disciplines at the end of the **Second Semester**.*
- *In both categories, the requirements of **Core Courses** and **Common Courses** shall remain the same.*

B. Four-Year Undergraduate Programme

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme shall have the following degree options:

- 1. Honours**
- 2. Honours with Research**

Eligibility and Progression

For Students of Multidisciplinary / Interdisciplinary Programme

Students completing a Three-Year Degree under the Multidisciplinary / Interdisciplinary Programme shall choose, in the Fourth Year, **one discipline** in which they have studied:

- **Six Discipline Specific Courses (DSCs)**, and
- **Five Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSEs)** during the first three years of study.

For Students of Single Core Discipline (Major)

Students completing a Three-Year Undergraduate Degree in a **Single Core Discipline (Major)** shall pursue the Fourth Year in their **Major Discipline**.

Programme Components

To achieve holistic and multidisciplinary education, the HEI/College shall offer courses from every Department before the commencement of each semester. The list shall include courses under:

1. Majors
2. Minors
3. Discipline-Specific Electives (DSE)
4. Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC)
5. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)
6. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
7. Value Addition Courses (VAC)

The entire 3-Year/4-Year Undergraduate Programme curriculum shall be divided into two parts:

1. **Core Courses**
2. **Common Courses**

A. Core Courses

The Core Courses comprise:

- Major courses (Discipline-Specific Core Courses(DSC) , Discipline-Specific Elective Courses (DSE)
- Minor Courses

All Core Courses shall carry **4 credits each**.

Major Courses

Major Courses are courses offered by a particular department for its own students.

- The minimum credit requirement for a **Single Core Discipline (Major)** over three years shall be **64 credits**. This shall comprise **16 courses**, including **5 Discipline-Specific Elective (DSE) Courses**.

Minor Courses

A Major Course offered by a department may also be treated as a Minor Course for students of other departments. The department may:

- Offer a separate course as a Minor Course, or repeat the same course(s) for Minor students.

Minimum Requirement: Minimum credits for a Minor Course over three years: **24 credits**, Equivalent to: **6 courses**

Common Courses

Common Courses are mandatory for all students enrolled in the 3-Year or 4-Year Undergraduate Programme. The Common Courses shall carry a total of **36 credits**, distributed among the following categories:

Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC) – Total Credits: 9

Courses offered by one department shall be treated as Multidisciplinary Courses for students of other departments.

- A student shall not opt for an MDC related to their own Core Courses (Major or Minor).
- Students should be encouraged to study different subjects in different semesters.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) – Total Credits: 8

These courses focus on Language and Communication Skills in:

- English
- Hindi
- Sanskrit

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) – Total Credits: 9

The HEI/College shall identify Skill Enhancement Courses to be offered during each semester.

Students may choose the Skill Course(s) of their preference from the courses offered.

Internship / Apprenticeship / Project / Community Outreach (I/A/P/C) or Work-Based Vocational Course – Total Credits: 4

These courses shall be common to all students and may include:

- Internship
- Apprenticeship
- Minor Project
- Community Outreach
- Work-Based Vocational Course

Important Provisions

- These activities shall normally be conducted during winter or summer vacations.
- Though formally offered in the Second Semester, students may be encouraged to select them at the end of the First Semester to facilitate participation during winter vacation.

Note: Work-Based Vocational Courses may not be offered during the initial phase of implementation.

Value Addition Courses (VAC) – Total Credits: 6

Value Addition Courses are common courses intended to enrich students' holistic learning experience.

- The HEI/College shall offer VACs in each semester.
 - One or more teachers may be assigned to teach these courses as required, irrespective of their disciplinary background or qualifications

Eligibility for Undergraduate Programmes

Basic Eligibility

As per UGC-CCFUGP, A student who has passed the **10+2 examination** or an equivalent examination in any stream from a recognised institution shall be eligible for admission to the Undergraduate Programme.

Admission Criteria

Admission to the 3-Year/4-Year Undergraduate Programme shall be based on:

- Preference for the Major Discipline, wherever applicable, or Preferred subject combinations chosen by the student.
-

Subject Availability

Admission to a discipline-specific course or Major shall be subject to: Availability of the subject, and Intake capacity of the College/Department/Centre.

Prerequisites

No student shall be eligible for admission to a programme unless they fulfil the prerequisites prescribed by the University for the respective course(s).

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

The HPU Undergraduate Programme is integrated with the **Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)** as notified by the University Grants Commission.

Important Provisions

- Credits earned by students shall be deposited in the ABC system by the University after each examination.
 - All students admitted under the HPU Undergraduate Programme must register with the Academic Bank of Credits as per regulatory guidelines.

Duration and Exit Options for UG Certificate, Diploma and Degree

The Undergraduate Programme may be of **3-Year or 4-Year duration** with multiple entry and exit options as follows:

Undergraduate Certificate

- Awarded after: Completion of **1 year (2 semesters)** , Earning **44 credits**, including:
 - 4 credits from I/A/P/C or Work-Based Vocational Course(s)

Undergraduate Diploma

Awarded after: Completion of **2 years (4 semesters)** , Earning **86 credits**

Three-Year Bachelor's Degree

Awarded after: Successful completion of **3 years (6 semesters)** , Earning **128 credits**

Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours)

Awarded after: Successful completion of **4 years (8 semesters)** , Earning **168 credits**

Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research)

Awarded after:

- Successful completion of **4 years (8 semesters)**
- Completion of a **Research Project/Dissertation** under the supervision of an eligible regular faculty member
- Earning **168 credits**, including:
 - **12 credits** for Research Project/Dissertation

Maximum Duration

Students may take a break during the course of study; however, the maximum duration for completion of the programme shall not exceed **7 years**.

Important Note

Any Certificate, Diploma, or Degree shall be awarded only after the student successfully clears all prescribed courses/papers up to that stage.

MDC subjects must be different from the student's:

- Major Subject
- Minor Subject

These courses are designed to provide knowledge outside the main discipline.

SEC, AEC & VAC Courses

SEC (Skill Enhancement Courses)

- Skill-based and practical-oriented courses
- SEC-1 and SEC-2 must be related to Core or Minor subjects

AEC (Ability Enhancement Courses)

- Language and communication courses

VAC (Value Addition Courses)

- Courses for personality and holistic development

Students may choose these courses from the available course pool.

Language Course Rules

- Students may choose a maximum of **two language subjects** as Core/Minor.
 - AEC language must be different from the language studied as Major/Minor.

Internship / Project / Community Work (I/A/P/C)

Internship, Apprenticeship, Project or Community Engagement activities shall generally be decided at the end of Semester I.

Some activities may be completed during:

- Winter Vacation
 - Summer Vacation

Eligibility for 4-Year Honours Programme

To continue in the 4th Year (Honours/Honours with Research), students must:

Successfully complete the 3-Year UG Degree

AND

Continue in only one discipline in which they have completed:

- 6 DSCs
- 5 DSEs

during the first three years.

Eligibility for Honours with Research

Students securing:

75% or more aggregate marks up to Semester VI

General Academic Guidelines for Undergraduate Programmes

1. Credit Structure

The prescribed credit framework includes **Lecture (L), Tutorial (T), and Practical (P)** components to ensure a balanced and holistic learning experience.

2. Subject Combination in the First Semester

During the first semester, students shall study **three different subjects within the same stream**, namely **A, B, and C**.

(Core and Minor combinations mentioned are illustrative in nature.)

3. Choice of Programme after Second Semester

At the conclusion of the second semester, students may opt for either:

- **Multidisciplinary / Interdisciplinary Programme**, or
- **Single Core Discipline (Major) Programme**

Students choosing the **Single Core Discipline (Major)** pathway must declare their **Major and Minor subjects** at the end of Semester II. The selected Major, Minor, and DSC combinations shall ordinarily remain unchanged up to Semester VI.

4. Provision for Change of Major

To facilitate academic flexibility, colleges may create **10% additional seats** over and above the sanctioned intake for students seeking a change of Major discipline.

Preference for change of Major shall be granted on the basis of:

- Higher CGPA/Merit
- No arrears/backlog in the First Year/Semesters

Vacant or unfilled seats may also be utilised for this purpose.

5. Recognition of Minor Courses

The DSCs studied from another discipline during the first two semesters by students pursuing a Major programme shall automatically be treated as **Minor Courses**.

6. Selection of Minor Subjects

A DSC offered by one discipline may serve as a Minor for another discipline. Students may choose Minor Courses from **two different subjects**, provided they earn a minimum of **12 credits in each subject**.

7. Multidisciplinary Courses (MDCs)

MDCs must be chosen from disciplines other than the student's declared Major and Minor subjects to promote interdisciplinary learning and broader academic exposure.

8. Selection of AEC / VAC / SEC Courses

AEC, VAC, and SEC-3 courses shall be selected from a common pool of courses offered by different disciplines.

- Some courses may be discipline-specific.

- Others may be open to students from all streams.

However, **SEC-1 and SEC-2 must be discipline-specific courses** related to the student's Core and Minor subjects.

9. Language Course Restrictions

Students may opt for a maximum of **two language courses** as Core and Minor subjects.

Additionally, the language selected under **AEC** must be different from the language studied under DSCs/Minor courses.

10. Internship / Apprenticeship / Project / Community Engagement

The component related to **Internship / Apprenticeship / Project / Community Engagement (I/A/P/C)** shall be finalised at the end of the first semester so that students may undertake related activities during the winter vacation.

11. Eligibility for 4-Year Bachelor's Degree

Students intending to pursue a **4-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours/Honours with Research)** must:

- Successfully complete the 3-Year UG Degree Programme, and
- Continue with only one discipline during both semesters of the fourth year.

The chosen discipline must be one in which the student has completed:

- Six DSCs, and
- Five DSEs during the first three years.

12. Eligibility for Honours with Research

Students securing **75% or above aggregate marks up to Semester VI** shall be eligible for admission to the **4-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research)** programme, subject to approval granted by Himachal Pradesh University to the concerned college.

13. Uniformity of Courses Across Programmes

One course per semester (DSC/Minor/MDC/SEC, etc.) offered in subjects common to multiple programmes such as:

- BCA & B.Sc.

- BPA & BA
- BFA & BA
- Shastri & BA

must remain identical in curriculum and structure.

14. Restriction for BA Students

Students enrolled in the BA Programme may opt for only **one DSC** from the following professional disciplines:

- Bachelor of Performing Arts (Dance/Music/Tabla/Vocal/Instrumental etc.)
- Bachelor of Fine Arts (Painting/Applied Arts/Sculpture etc.)

15. Conditions for Award of Major and Minor

The award of Major and Minor disciplines shall be subject to the following credit requirements:

Major

- **64 Credits** in a 3-Year UG Programme

Minor

- **84 Credits** in a 4-Year UG Programme in a single Major discipline.
- **28 Credits** in a 4-Year UG Programme in a single Minor discipline.

16. Dissertation / Project Work

The Dissertation/Project component shall commence in **Semester VII**. However, evaluation and assessment shall be conducted in both **Semester VII and Semester VIII**.

A student who has cleared the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. School Education Board or an examination accepted as equivalent there to by the various bodies of the H.P. University will be given admission strictly according to merit and reservation roster for various reserved categories of students as per the H.P. University Guidelines.

1 B.Sc 1st

Provided that the Candidate has passed the qualifying examination, i.e, 10+2 with Science Stream shall be eligible for admission to B.Sc.

2 BA 1st

Provided that the candidate who has passed the qualifying examination, i.e. 10+2 with any stream is eligible for admission to B.A 1st

3 B.Com 1st

Provided That the candidate who has passed the qualifying examination, i.e. 10+2 with commerce stream shall be given preference to admission to B.Com

4 BA With Maths

Provided that the Candidate who has studied Mathematics as subject in qualifying exam i.e. 10+2 and has obtained 45% marks in aggregate or 45% in Mathematics .

ABOUT THE BACHELOR OF VOCATION (B.Voc.) DEGREE PROGRAMME :

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has launched a scheme on skill development based job oriented higher education programme as a part of College/University education, leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) degree. This degree Programme is unique with the provision of multiple entry and exit at different levels of NSQF from level 5 to 7, viz. Diploma/Advance Diploma and Degree in compliance to the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF). Multiple entry and exit will allow students the flexibility to earn and study as per their convenience.

Course Structure :

B. Voc. programme is designed with provision for multiple exit levels. All the candidates enrolled for diploma courses or further will be treated at par from the second semester onwards. Students may exit after six months with the certificate (NSQF Level 4) or they may continue for diploma or advance diploma level courses leading to B. Voc. degree.

Following table provides a snapshot of the various certificates and their duration:-

Eligibility Conditions

- ❖ Admission to the B.Voc. programme shall be governed by the rules and regulations of Himachal Pradesh University.
- ❖ The eligibility criteria for admission to the B.Voc. degree programme shall be as follows:
 - A candidate must have passed 10+2 in any stream from a recognised Board/University established by law in India, with English as a compulsory subject and a minimum of 45% marks in aggregate. **OR**
 - Any examination conducted by a University/Board/College or School in a foreign country recognised as equivalent to 10+2 by the Vice-Chancellor/Equivalence Committee of the University or on the recommendations of the Association of Indian Universities, with at least 45% marks; **OR**
 - As per the eligibility norms prescribed by the College/University for admission to undergraduate courses in Centres of Excellence.
- ❖ Vocational subjects under NSQF shall be given due weightage equivalent to any other general education subject while considering admission to undergraduate courses, as per UGC reference No. F.1 -52/2013 (CC/NSQF) dated 30.04.2014.
- ❖ As on 1st July 2025, the age of the candidate should not exceed 23 years in case of boys and 25 years in case of girls under the General Category. Relaxation for SC/ST candidates shall be provided as per University norms. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to a maximum of six months for reasons to be recorded in writing.
- ❖ Reservation rules shall be applicable as per the norms/guidelines of the Government of Himachal Pradesh.
- ❖ Candidates belonging to the SC/ST category shall be granted a relaxation of 5% marks for admission purposes, i.e., a minimum of 40% aggregate marks at the 10+2 level.
- ❖ Candidates having compartment/re-appear in the qualifying examination shall not be eligible for admission to the B.Voc. programmes.
- ❖ A candidate shall not be permitted to pursue two full-time undergraduate courses simultaneously.
- ❖ The University reserves the right to cancel any admission at any stage if found in violation of the rules.
- ❖ In all matters relating to undergraduate admissions, the decision of the Admission Committee/Vice-Chancellor, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, shall be final and binding.
- ❖ All legal matters about undergraduate admissions shall be subject to the jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh only.
- ❖ Admission to the B.Voc. programmes in Retail Management and Hospitality & Tourism (Semester -I) shall be made purely based on merit in the qualifying examination (10+2 or equivalent).
- ❖ Admission to Semester I of the skill-based courses under NSQF shall be made under the following categories:

Category 1

Students who have already acquired NSQF Certification Level 4 in a particular industry sector and wish to continue in the same skill-based programme.

Category 2

Students who have acquired NSQF Certification Level 4 but wish to change their trade and seek admission in a different skill-based programme.

Category 3

Students who have passed the 10+2 examination through conventional schooling without any background in vocational training.

Note: Regarding selection of students for B.Voc. programme, 10% extra weightage shall be given to Category-1 and 5% extra weightage shall be given to Category-2 in 10+2 examination. Final list of students shall be decided on merit.

Internship Programme

Internship of six weeks after the completion of each year is an integral and essential component of the B.Voc. Degree Programme. The internship shall also carry credits, which will be included in the final evaluation of the skill components.

Guest Lectures

Guest lectures form an important part of the B.Voc. programme. At every level/semester, guest lectures are organized in which experts from the Retail and Hospitality & Tourism industries are invited to share their valuable practical knowledge and apprise students of the various skills and career opportunities available in the field.

Industrial Visits

Industrial visits are arranged for the students of B.Voc. Retail Management as well as B.Voc. Hospitality & Tourism Management. These visits provide practical exposure and firsthand knowledge about the functioning, operations, and management of related industries.

On-the-Job Training (OJT)

On-the-Job Training (OJT) is an important component of the B.Voc. programme and is conducted at the end of every level/semester. During the training, students gain practical exposure to organizational working, management practices, job roles, coordination skills, and customer handling techniques.

The Himachal Pradesh Kaushal Vikas Nigam (HPKVN) fully sponsors the internship component and also facilitates the skill component (60%) of the programme along with the coursework throughout the duration of the programme.

Candidates enrolled in this programme are also entitled to receive the “**Kaushal Vikas Bhatta**” as per the policy of the Government of Himachal Pradesh.

General Rules:

The admission will be on the basis of centralized entrance tests conducted by the SPU/HPU for the session 2026-27. The students interested in admission to the institution, will have to apply separately after the declaration of results by the HPU. The final list of candidates will be decided on merit.

An applicant should not be more than 26 years of age as on 1-7-2026 in case of boys & 28 years in case of girls. The upper age limit is 29 years for SC/ST applicants. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to a maximum of 6 months for reasons to be recorded in writing.

- 1 A candidate who fails in 1st semester may be permitted to join 2nd semester but she/he shall not be permitted to proceed from 1st to 3rd semester without appearing in 2nd semester examination.
- 2 15% and 7.5% reservation is available to SC and ST applicants respectively. In case the reserved seats remain vacant, the same shall be considered open for the general category applicants.
- 3 The admission of a student migrating from another university shall be treated as provisional and shall be confirmed only on the production of migration certificate and character certificate in original from Head of the Institution last attended.

Note: The eligible candidate who has passed Honours course in concerned subject will be

given weightage as per the SP University, Mandi norms.

Eligibility Conditions:

Candidates who have passed Bachelor's Degree examination with at least 50% marks in aggregate or 45% marks or Honours in the concerned subjects are eligible. Relaxation of 5% marks in minimum eligibility for admission will be given to SC/ST candidates.

Procedure of Admission:

- 1 The candidate should fill the admission form in her/his own handwriting and submit it to the admission committee. The admission form must be complete in all respects.
- 2 A candidate seeking admission to first year of any course must appear before the concerned admission committee with her/his parents or guardian.
- 3 A candidate seeking admission to any class should appear before the concerned admission committee, thereafter the Chief Convener of the Faculty concerned.
- 4 When admission is granted to a candidate, the candidate must deposit fees within specified time failing which her/his admission will stand cancelled.
- 5 At the time of appearing before admission committee, the applicant should submit her/his application form complete in all respects with other documents in the sequence given below:
 - (i) Admission Form
 - (ii) Library Registration Form
 - (iii) Character Certificate in original
 - (iv) Attested copies of Matriculation, 10+2 certificate & attested copy of Bachelor Degree Certificate.
 - (v) Attested copy of H.P.U. Registration card (if any).
 - (vi) Himachali bonafied certificate for girls.
 - (vii) Three passport size photographs.

Half Fee Concession

1. If two sons of the same parents are studying in the college, only one will be eligible for fee concession.
2. Fee concession may be granted to economically weak but meritorious students on the recommendation of the Fee Concession Committee.
3. Students with more than 40% disability are eligible for 100% fee concession.

4. Scholarships are awarded as per the norms and rules prescribed by the department.
5. Students must apply online through the NSP 2.0 portal within the notified dates.
6. Only regular students with at least 75% attendance and passing marks in all subjects are eligible for scholarship/concession.

Fines and Penalties

1. Failure to pay dues on or before the due date will attract a fine of Rs. 5 per day.
2. The name of a student may be struck off from the college rolls if she/he remains absent without sanctioned leave for 10 consecutive days.
3. For re-admission, the student must be accompanied by her/his parent or guardian.
4. Re-admission is permissible with a fine of Rs. 100/- for the first time and Rs. 200/- for the second time on the recommendation of
5. If re-admission is not sought within 7 days after the name is struck off, an additional fine of Rs. 10 per day (maximum 10 days) will be charged.
6. The Principal may expel or rusticate a student found guilty of misconduct.
7. The library security deposit will lapse if not claimed within one year after leaving the college.
8. Use of mobile phones in the college campus, except in designated zones, will attract a fine of Rs. 100. Repeated violations may lead to higher fines and confiscation of the phone.
9. Carrying intoxicants or smoking materials within the campus will attract a fine of Rs. 500.
10. Carrying the college identity card is compulsory. Students without identity cards will be fined Rs. 50.

Other Fines

- a) Absence per period: Rs. 1/-
- b) Absence per practical: Rs. 3/-
- c) Absence in Minor Test: Rs. 100 per paper
- d) Delay in returning library books: Rs. 1/- per day per volume

Note: Students are advised to preserve the fee receipt issued by the college. In case of loss, a duplicate copy can be obtained from the clerk on payment of Rs. 100.

College Library

The college library has approximately 29,000 books, including reference and general books.



The library subscribes to newspapers, magazines, and journals regularly. A well-maintained reading room is available for students and teachers. The library is registered under the N-LIST Programme of UGC, providing access to e-journals and e-books through INFLIBNET. The library is partially computerised, and efforts are being made for further modernisation.

Separate departmental libraries have been established in science departments.

Guidelines for the Use of the Library

1. Students must collect the library card after admission by producing the fee receipt.
2. The tutor, librarian, and Principal must sign the library card.
3. Normally, two books are issued for 30 days.
4. The librarian has the right to recall books at any time.
5. Reference books, journals, and magazines are not issued.
6. Students are responsible for the books issued to them. Lost or damaged books must be replaced or compensated at the latest market price.

Book Bank

A Book Bank has been established to provide textbooks to needy and meritorious students.

Books donated by teachers are issued to students according to availability.

College Identity Card

Every admitted student is issued a college identity card with personal details and a photograph.

A duplicate identity card may be issued on payment of Rs. 50, along with a copy of the FIR in case of loss.

Leave Rules for Students

1. Leave must be taken with the prior permission of the Principal.
2. Leave applications must be signed by the parent/guardian and recommended by the tutor.
3. Tutors may sanction leave up to 5 days; longer leave requires approval of the Principal.
4. Students must personally ensure that their leave is sanctioned and that teachers are informed.
5. Medical leave exceeding three days must be supported by a medical certificate.
6. Students participating in sports, NCC, NSS, trekking, and cultural activities must obtain prior permission from the Principal.
7. General leave is counted only for relaxation in fines and not as attendance.
8. Participation in approved activities such as sports, NCC, NSS, and cultural programmes is counted towards attendance.

Annual Prize Distribution Function

The Annual Prize Distribution Function is held every year in the last week of February.



Prizes are awarded to students excelling in academics, sports, NCC, NSS, cultural, and co-curricular activities.

Academic Awards

- Prizes are awarded to students securing first or second position in

aggregate CGPA in university examinations.

- Students securing a place in the university merit list are awarded the Roll of Honour and prizes.
- Prizes are also awarded for:
 - a) 100% attendance
 - b) Best Reader among boys and girls

Sports / Cultural / NCC / NSS Awards

- Prizes are awarded for positions secured at National, State, University, and Inter-College levels.
- NCC cadets are awarded for RD Parade participation, camps, shooting, and Best Cadet honours.
- Awards are given to the best NSS volunteer and group leader.
- College Colours are awarded for outstanding achievements in sports, NCC, NSS, and Rovers & Rangers.

Career Guidance and Counselling Cell

- The cell organises seminars, counselling sessions, and placement activities.
- It helps students make suitable career choices and provides placement opportunities.

College Magazine - Devdhara

The college publishes its annual magazine *Devdhara*.

The magazine provides a platform for students to express creative and analytical ideas.

It contains sections in English, Hindi, Pahari, Sanskrit, Science, and Commerce. Selected paintings and articles by students are also published.

NCC



- The college has Air Wing, Army Wing Boys, and Army Wing Girls units.
- NCC provides training in flying, gliding, shooting, trekking, mountaineering, and adventure activities.

- 'C' Certificate holders receive 2% weightage for PG admissions.
- Students above 16½ years are eligible to join NCC.

NSS

- The college has two NSS units with 100 students each.
- NSS volunteers participate in social service and special camp



activities.

- Students completing the required work hours and camps receive certificates and PG admission weightage.

Educational Tours and Excursions

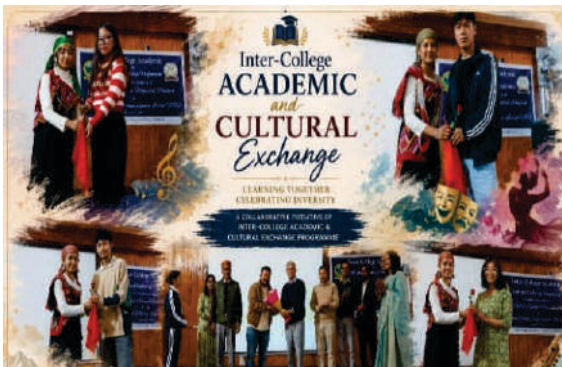
- Educational tours are organised during the winter vacation for final-year students.

- Tours and excursions are conducted only with prior permission of the college administration and accompanying teachers.

- Various clubs and societies organise debates, quizzes, talks, and competitions.



- Students are encouraged to celebrate occasions of national and cultural importance.

Disaster Management Club

- The club prepares volunteers to provide immediate relief during natural calamities and emergencies.
- The club works in coordination with NGOs and local administration.

College Students Central Association (CSCA)



The CSCA is constituted to develop leadership qualities among students. It provides a platform for addressing students' issues and welfare activities.

Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

The PTA works for the overall development of the college.

It promotes cooperation between parents and teachers.

The PTA helps maintain a healthy academic atmosphere in the college.

Parents are encouraged to participate actively in PTA meetings and activities.

Old Students Association (OSA)

- The college takes pride in its Old Students Association (OSA), which actively works for the upliftment and development of the institution.

- The association also provides an opportunity for reunion and interaction among former students.

- The OSA contributes towards enriching the academic, cultural, and social environment of the college.

Hostels

The college has three tribal hostels, including two for girls and one for



boys.

- One girls' hostel has a capacity of 99 students, while the boys' hostel accommodates 69 students.

- The second girls' hostel with a capacity of 72 students is temporarily being used for academic purposes.

- The hostels are equipped with facilities such as sports amenities, a mess, a common room, a television, a gymnasium, and library facilities.

- Any admitted student of the college may apply for hostel accommodation.

- Hostel admission forms can be obtained from the college library on payment of the prescribed fee.

- Admission to the hostel is granted strictly on a merit basis.

Hostel Rules

1. A student may apply for hostel accommodation only after taking admission in the college and on the recommendation of the Hostel Warden.
2. Admission to failed students shall not be granted.
3. Rooms shall be allotted on dates notified by the Hostel Warden.
4. No resident shall change the allotted room without prior permission of the Warden.
5. Hostel admission must be sought afresh in every academic session.
6. Parents or guardians must accompany the student at the time of hostel admission.
7. The Warden must be satisfied regarding the conduct and regular payment of hostel dues by the resident.
8. A student may ordinarily stay in the hostel for a maximum period of three years while pursuing an undergraduate degree.
9. Hostel admission shall close ten days after the closure of college admissions.
10. All residents must follow hostel discipline and timings strictly.
11. Leaving the hostel premises without permission from the Hostel Warden is strictly prohibited.
12. Unauthorised occupation of hostel rooms or seats may lead to expulsion, forfeiture of security deposit, or fine.
13. In case of non-payment of hostel dues or violation of hostel rules, the Warden may lock the resident's room.
14. Use of electric heaters or similar appliances in hostel rooms is strictly prohibited.
15. Every resident shall be responsible for the safety of hostel furniture and property.
16. Damage to hostel property may invite disciplinary action, including expulsion from the hostel.
17. Students and parents must submit an undertaking against participation in political or anti-disciplinary activities.

18. Residents shall not shift from their allotted rooms without permission from the Warden.
19. Students must remain in their rooms during night hours unless permitted otherwise.
20. Hostel residents must carry the Hostel Identity Card at all times.
21. Hostel gates shall remain closed from 8:00 PM to 5:00 AM.
22. Entry of outsiders and guests into the hostel premises is strictly prohibited.
23. Use of drugs, intoxicants, smoking, and ragging in the hostel is strictly prohibited.
24. All boarders must clear hostel and mess dues on time.
25. Residents are expected to maintain cleanliness and hygiene in the hostel premises.
26. Students are advised not to keep cash, jewellery, or valuables in their rooms.



27. Before leaving the hostel, every resident must obtain clearance from the Warden and properly hand over hostel property.
28. Local guardian's address must be registered with the Hostel Warden.
29. Normally, only three to four days' leave per month shall be sanctioned to hostel residents.
30. Violation of hostel rules may attract a fine of Rs. 100/- and may also be reported to the parents or guardians.
31. Hostel security deposit shall lapse if not claimed within six months after leaving the hostel.
32. All hostel rooms must be vacated within twenty-four hours after the completion of examinations.

Conduct and Discipline in Hostel

1. Students shall use hostel property carefully and responsibly.

2. Damage to hostel property shall be recovered from the concerned student.
 3. Students must maintain discipline and a peaceful atmosphere within the hostel premises.
 4. Misbehaviour with the Warden, teachers, employees, or fellow students may lead to disciplinary action.
 5. Harassment, teasing, violence, or ragging is strictly prohibited.
 6. Theft or damage to hostel or college property is considered a serious offence.
 7. Writing on walls, sticking posters, or distributing unauthorised notices is prohibited.
 8. Creating noise or disturbance through loud music or other activities is not allowed.
 9. Organizing unauthorized meetings inside hostel premises is prohibited.
 10. Students visiting the common room or dining hall must remain in proper dress.
 11. In cases of wilful disobedience or indiscipline, the Warden may ask the student to vacate the hostel, subject to approval by the Principal.
- g. Organising meetings without prior permission of the Principal.
 - h. Using mobile phones in classrooms or playing loud music on campus.
 - i. Plucking flowers or damaging plants on the campus.
 - j. Creating disturbance in classrooms or corridors.
 - k. Bringing vehicles inside the campus except in designated parking areas.
 - l. Wearing indecent or inappropriate dress on the college campus.

General Conduct and Discipline

1. Every student must carry the college Identity Card and produce it whenever demanded by the college authorities.
2. Ragging in any form inside or outside the college campus and hostels is strictly prohibited and punishable under law.
3. The following acts shall be treated as misconduct and indiscipline:
 - a. Writing obscene words on blackboards, walls, or furniture.
 - b. Damaging desks, doors, furniture, or college property.
 - c. Smoking, consuming drugs or alcohol, chewing tobacco or pan masala, and spitting within the campus.
 - d. Bringing outsiders or anti-social elements into the college campus
 - e. Writing slogans, pasting posters, banners, or notices without permission.
 - f. Misbehaving with teachers, staff, or fellow students.

Anti-Smoking / Anti-Tobacco

1. Smoking and the use of tobacco products are strictly prohibited within the college campus and hostel premises.

- Any student found smoking or using tobacco products shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs. 200/-.
- Such acts may also invite disciplinary action, including suspension or expulsion from the college.

ANTI-RAGGING POLICY

According to the judgment/order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India (2001), ragging is defined as:

"Any disorderly conduct, whether by words spoken or written, or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship, or psychological harm, or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or junior student; or asking any student to do any act or perform something which such student would not do in the ordinary course, and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or any other student."

DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS MAY INCLUDE



1 Withholding of scholarship or other benefits.



2 Debarring from participation in college events and activities.



3 Withholding of examination results.



4 Suspension or expulsion from the hostel, mess or college.



5 Initiation of legal proceedings under criminal law.



6 Imposition of a fine up to ₹25,000 along with a public apology.



In cases involving serious allegations, an FIR shall be lodged against the offenders with the police, and the matter shall be dealt with in a court of law. If convicted, the offender may be punished with imprisonment for up to three years, or with a fine up to ₹50,000, or with both. Such an offender shall stand expelled from the institution and shall not be eligible for admission to any other institution for a period of three years.
