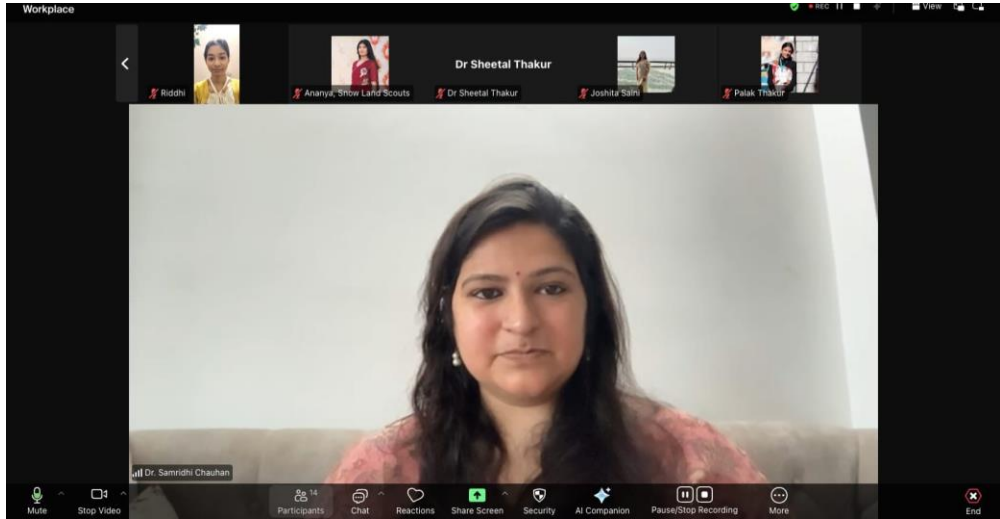

7	Brief Report संक्षिप्त प्रतिवेदन	The Department of Sociology, Government College Kullu organized an online lecture session for the students of B.A. Sociology on 15 March 2026. The session aimed to create awareness about the growing issue of cybercrime and to understand it from a gender-sensitive perspective. The lecture was delivered by Dr. Samridhi Chauhan, Assistant Professor (Law), School of Law, Sushant University, Gurugram. The main objective of the lecture was to help students understand the gendered dimensions of cybercrime, encourage informed discussions on online safety, and promote critical thinking about how digital technologies intersect with issues of gender, power, and social structures. Dr. Chauhan provided an insightful analysis of different forms of cybercrime, particularly those affecting women and marginalized groups.
