Educational Tour to World Book Fair, New Delhi

The Department of Economics and the Department of Hindi, Government College Kullu, in collaboration with Government College Panarsa, organized an educational visit to the World Book Fair, New Delhi. The tour aimed to enrich students' academic and cultural perspectives by exploring the vast literary collection at the fair and visiting Delhi's historical landmarks.

A total of 49 students (20 from Department of Economics, 11 from Hindi of GC Kullu, and 18 from GC Panarsa) participated, accompanied by four faculty members. At the World Book Fair, students explored books on economics, literature, and policy-making, and gained insights into contemporary knowledge trends.

Apart from the book fair, students explored several historical and cultural landmarks in Delhi, which provided them with a deeper understanding of India's rich heritage.

- Akshardham Temple and Sound & Water Show: The students were mesmerized by the grandeur of Akshardham Temple. .
- Red Fort & Sound and Light Show: A visit to the iconic Red Fort helped students understand India's colonial history and struggle for independence. The sound and light show narrated the story of the Mughal era and India's freedom movement, bringing history to life.
- Qutub Minar: The group visited the UNESCO World Heritage Site Qutub Minar, where they admired its architectural brilliance and learned about Delhi Sultanate history.
- Rajghat: The students paid homage to Mahatma Gandhi at Rajghat, reflecting on his philosophy of non-violence and the Indian freedom movement.
- India Gate: The visit to India Gate, a war memorial dedicated to Indian soldiers, instilled a sense of patriotism among students.

This tour was not just a recreational visit but an academic and cultural enrichment experience. The collaboration between the two colleges facilitated academic discussions, teamwork, and knowledge-sharing among students of different disciplines. The World Book Fair and Delhi tour was a remarkable success, offering students a well-rounded educational experience. Such initiatives should be encouraged in the future to enhance students' academic and personal development.
