

- 1. There is a suggestion from the students to have rational practices in teaching, so that interaction of the teacher with the taught could be broadened. The teaching should also focus on the career based needs of the students
- 2. According to parents other curricular activities be minimized in order to maximize the academic related works
- 3. Some students are of the opinion that the political activities in the college should be completely banned.
- 4. That the time table weaknesses and the subject clashes be minimized
- 5. That clerical staff be increased to avoid long queues of the students for paying fees.

Around one hundred cadets donated blood at blood donation camp on 5th and 6th December.
