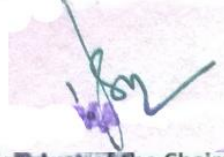

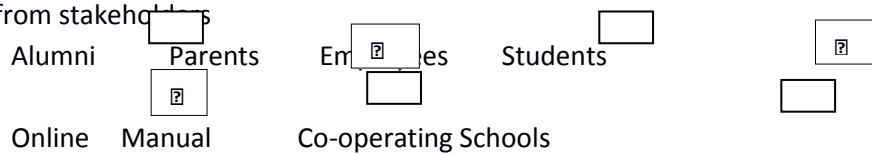

Feedback from students

A number of vital points are observed while analyzing the feedback collected online from the students. Under this feedback, the following common observing pattern has emerged

1. *There is a suggestion from the students to have rational practices in teaching, so that interaction of the teacher with the taught could be broadened. The teaching should also focus on the career based needs of the students*
2. *According to parents other curricular activities be minimized in order to maximize the academic related works*
3. *Some students are of the opinion that the political activities in the college should be completely banned.*
4. *That the time table weaknesses and the subject clashes be minimized*
5. *That clerical staff be increased to avoid long queues of the students for paying fees.*

The annual system in the Himachal Pradesh University is in practice. The assessment of the students is based on house examination that is of hundred marks. However only a ratio of this i.e. 20% is added in the final examination. So the final examination of each subject is of 80 marks. Likewise in science, the same annual system is in existence along with practical examination.

Evaluation Examination committee is constituted in each academic year in the college that looks after conduct of house examination, evaluation of Question papers & record maintenance of students. Class tests are conducted and evaluated at teachers' level.

HPU holds final examinations & declares results in a definite time frame.

3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility:-

(i) This college encourages the faculty and the students to take up activities related to extension and social responsibilities.

(ii) In addition to regular work, a majority of faculty members actively involve themselves in social activities through NCC, NSS, Rovers and Rangers, Parents and Teachers Association, Clubs and Societies etc. Outreach activities such as :- Army Wing, 48 cadets participated in a camp at Darang in district Mandi from 21st to 30th July where Under Officer Sunita and cadet Varun were adjusted the best shooters. Varun was also selected for TSC camp at Ropar in Punjab state, cadet Yan Chand and cadet Suresh Kumar won first prize in shooting at Pandoh camp held in between 24th October and 2nd November, the college was also awarded as the best college in Discipline, Under Officer Sanjeev was declared best drill commander and Chander Kumar was declared the best All Round Cadet in the same camp. Seven cadets were awarded BEE certificate and Nine cadets were awarded CEE certificate with A and B Grade respectively.

(iii) Under NCC Air Wing, two girl cadets namely Chand Kumari and Sumna Devi participated in 64th Republic Day Prade at New Delhi and also participated in Prime Minister's Rally on January 28th, 2013. At Darang camp from 21st to 30th July 2012, Varun was declared the Best Shooter and won 1st prize in Group Song, cadets collected Rs.2363/- on Flag Day on

September 5th,2012. Cadet Jitender completed Basic Training course at Atal Bihari Bajpai Mountaineering Institute, Manali, cadet Lal Krishan and Suraj were selected for the attachment camp at National Air Force Academy, Hyderabad, Air cadet Ravinder Kumar won Silver Medal in Patiala shooting championship, Cadet Babli Thakur and cadet Sanjay Kumar were declared best cadets among the girls and the boys respectively at Ropar in Punjab. Around one hundred cadets donated blood at blood donation camp on 5th and 6th December.

(iv) Under NSS, Red Ribbon Club organized Aids Awareness Day on December17th,2012.

(v) Under Rovers and Rangers, eight Rovers participated in 'Praveen camp' at Taradevi in Shimla to learn the techniques of fire fighting training of first aid from 31st July to 4th August,2012, twelve Rovers and fourteen Rangers participated in cleanliness campaign at Bijli Mahadev on 28th August, nine Rovers and nine Rangers participated in state level function at Baijnathin Kangra district.

Frequent plying of buses during the peak hours of college teaching to far off or remote areas of town and villages for the convenience of the students was initiated by Road Transport, Government of Himachal Pradesh on the request of college administration.
